FROM THE PRINCIPAL

WHAT IS THE VIRUS DOING FOR US?

The last 3 months have been life-changing. We have been forced to change the way we live, play, interact and work and in our respect the way we teach. The vast majority of us can't wait for things to get back to 'normal'. I have spent time reflecting on this experience as a husband, father, friend, colleague and principal. Has it all been bad or negative?

Bill Gates recently shared a few insights about COVID-19. Bill's spin on the virus is not so much about what the virus is doing to us but what it is doing for us.

He suggests:

- It has taught us we are all equal and all just as vulnerable
- It reminds us that we are all connected and what affects one, affects another
- It reminds us how precious our health is
- It reminds us how short life is and what is truly important
- It challenges our materialistic tendencies and how little is really essential
- It reminds us that family comes first and our true work is to look after and protect one another
- It reminds us that the power of free will is in our hands the power to choose to share, to support and to help co-operate

These are lessons that cannot be packaged in a compact, well-resourced and approved curriculum. They are lessons learnt through life's experiences. Each one of us has learnt a great deal during this time. Last week I came across a reflection piece which asked me to consider what were the unintended benefits emerging from the pandemic in my life, which I began to extend to Holy Spirit. I posed the following to the staff: What do you want to Reduce, Reframe, Remove in our school community? We were asked to consider:

- **REDUCE:** the clutter, what has become important, core work? Review current initiatives with a view to reducing or clustering them.
- **REFRAME:** strengthen new connections between what was, what is and what is to come?
- REMOVE: distractors, (possibly what we once deemed essential).

Some of the many conversations I have had with colleagues and parents have stretched my thinking to what I have reduced, reframed and removed both personally and professionally. I wondered what each member of the extended Holy Spirit community has reduced, reframed and removed? I wondered what the virus has done for us? Please take the time to reflect on the positives that may have come from the COVID-19 pandemic, even if they are minimal.

WELCOME BACK

It has been so good to see so many of our students return to school over the past week and a half in house groups. We are really looking forward to seeing everyone return next week. Unfortunately, while we will have all of our students, we still need to adhere to NSW Government social distancing guidelines, see below for an outline of these restrictions.

As of Monday, 25th of May, all students from Kinder to Year 6 are expected to return to school as per advice from the NSW Government. All students not attending school will need to notify the school office or lodge through the Compass platform. Drop off and pick-ups will be the same as they have been this week (summary below). If your child has any flu-like symptoms, could you please keep them at home. The student free days planned for Term 2 have been cancelled. We will continue to keep you updated via our Compass and social media platforms.

We are still taking enrolments for Kinder in 2021. It is vital that we receive enrolments forms for all our siblings as soon as possible as we finalise our enrolments for next year.

ROAD SAFETY: PICKUPS AND DROP OFFS

Following these rules will not only keep the students safe, but it may also save fines being given out as there have been a number of Police cars who have been monitoring the area around that time.
