 Get the ego out of the way.)
- Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. (Do what is fair for everyone.)
- Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. (We forgive those who are unkind to us. Look for ways to show kindness to others.)
- Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. (We do what is right just because we know it is the right thing to do.)
- Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. (We try to bring God's peace to the world. We control our behaviour so people can see Jesus in us.)
- Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. (We are willing to stand up for God's laws even if we are teased or insulted)

Take a moment this week to consider how blessed we are to be living in our beautiful state with a bountiful number of blessings we are able to celebrate.
