From the Principal...

We are a diverse community made up of 330 children, in excess of 35 staff and 600 parents. Each and every one of us is different. Different in the way we look, the way we behave, what we believe and how we approach things. The one thing we all have in common is a close connection to Holy Spirit.

One of the great strengths of our school is the diversity of our community. Interacting with people of different cultures, backgrounds and thinking strengthens our own capacity to broaden our own thinking and ideas. As a nation, Australia has one of the most culturally diverse populations in the world. These cultures have added to the richness of our First Nations people and have made Australia what it is today, a place that is safe to live in and one that aspires to respect all.

As a school, one of our core expectations is 'Respect for Others'. This is proudly displayed on every newsletter, our website and in several places in and around our school. The children of HSS learn these values very quickly. We work with them to 'break open' what respect means and looks like. We must continue to challenge ourselves and one another to be 'people of the cross'. Just as Jesus spent time with the lepers and the outcasts (Mark 1: 40-45) we are called to treat everyone with respect.

Children will sometimes come home sharing details about an interaction at school that hasn't gone well. Perhaps they were called a name, perhaps they heard poor language or maybe there was inappropriate physical contact. Often they will share the name of a child who had behaved inappropriately. How we respond as adults is critical. We can choose to blame the other child or we can choose to support our child in how they should respond. We should certainly speak with respect. We should never speak badly about other children in front of our children. We are adults and if we want our children to develop skills of tolerance, compassion and respect we must reflect these ourselves.

Our children watch and listen to us closely, they will model our behaviours. They are the future leaders of our society. It is incumbent on us to model to our future generation of global citizens to search for the good in others.

Oliva has now graduated. Attendance at her classes are growing. Her kiosk is thriving and she is helping her children with their homework. She aims to become a pastor and run for leadership in the next local election - to help her community to 'Be More.'

Approximately 260 million children do not have the chance to go to school.

At Holy Spirit School, students have taken home Project Compassion boxes and there is also a large one located in the front office. We will be collecting money for the rest of the term.
